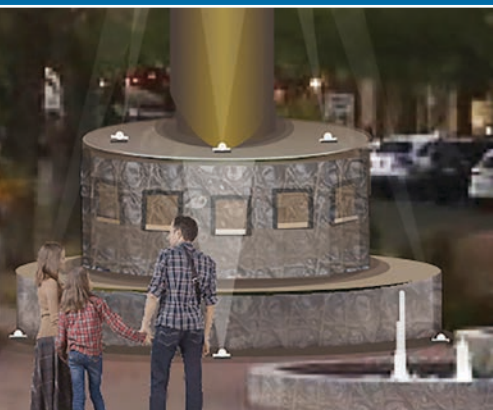


COMMEMORATION SPOTS AVAILABLE

Commemoration spots cost anywhere from \$500 to \$ 10,000.

ABOUT THE SCULPTURE:

“Fountain of Light” is the result of a long-time love affair between its creator, Brian Schader, and his adopted hometown of Fountain Hills, Arizona. The inspiration behind this magnificent glass spire was the town’s Fountain, celebrating its 50th year in 2020. Few will argue the power and majesty of the grand Fountain, which held the record as the highest fountain in the world for nearly three decades after its creation.

The Fountain acts as a time keeper for the residents of Fountain Hills , and is a special treat for those who can experience its glow in the hours during the spectacular sunrises and sunsets of the area. But it’s the evening hours when the Fountain really struts its stuff. The Fountain of Light statue will offer that same reflective magic, and will stay lit during evening and sunrise hours, not just at 15-minute intervals like the namesake Fountain. The statue went through a rigorous public process owing to the community’s nod to Dark Sky principles. It will be gently lit from the interior with a soft glow that will not project upward.

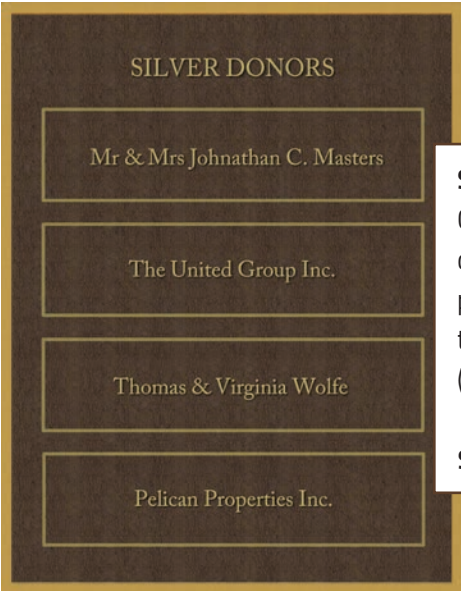
Located in the center median of the Avenue of the Fountains in front of Fountain Hills Town Hall, this parklike setting will feature numerous benches to sit and contemplate the amazing history of our town and to remember the individuals who will be commemorated there with bronze plaques.



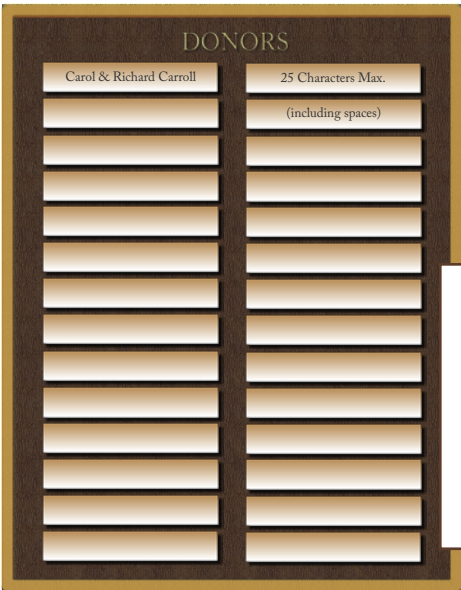
Fountain of Light,

COMMEMORATION PROGRAMS AND COSTS:

There will be two sizes of bronze plaques: Large 16x20 plaques will tell the history of our community and the Fountain, along with special group commemorations of early leaders of our community. Smaller 8x10 Plaques will be available for individuals to purchase a shared portion of the plaque, as follows:

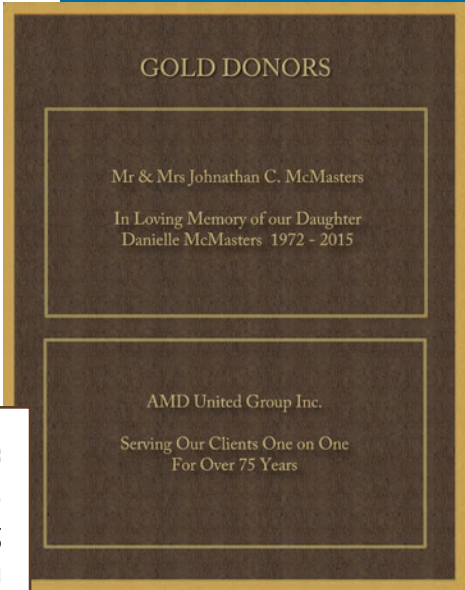
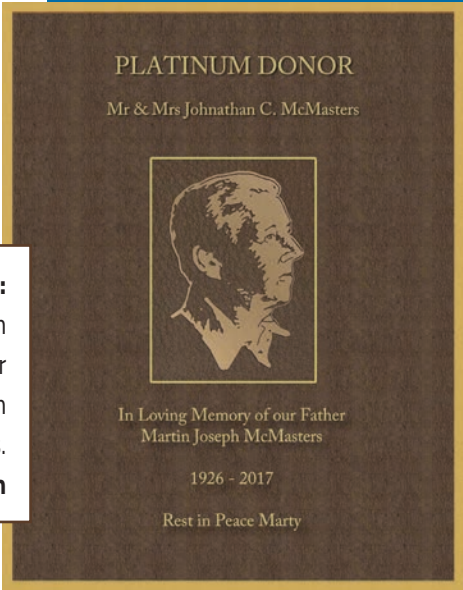


SILVER DONOR PLAQUE:
Quarter-share plaques approx. 6"x 1.5" engraved plaque allowing 2 lines of type, 30 characters each line (including spaces).
4 donors per plaque.
\$2500 each



PUBLIC SUPPORT PLAQUE:
A .50" x 3" brass add-on plates, allowing for a maximum of 25 characters (including spaces.) 28 donors per plaque.
\$500 each

PLATINUM DONOR:
Single commemoration of an individual, family or organization with custom logo or likeness.
\$10,000 each



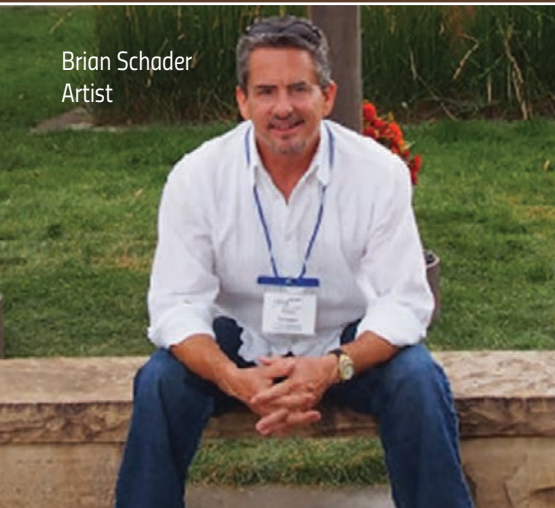
GOLD DONOR PLAQUE:
Half-share plaques approx. 6" x 3" engraving, allowing for 4 lines of type or a combination of logo or likeness with copy (custom designed) . 2 donors per plaque. **\$5,000 each plus \$200 for logo or likeness.**



ABOUT THE ARTIST

Brian Schader has been a Fountain Hills resident since 1991 and a professional artist for over 34 years. Most widely known for his paintings of the American Southwest, Brian's creative direction during the last 9 years has been contemporary additive sculpture. In the past few years, Brian has installed 8 monumental public art works, including 2 smaller works within Fountain Hills. His work is exhibited exclusively through the prominent galleries listed on his website. Brian is a member of The National Sculpture Society, and among his other civic involvement, he is a member of the Fountain Hills Public Art Committee, sits on the Board of the Fountain Hills Theater as well and also the Advisory Board of The Tree in Honor Project.
